TITLE I, PART A PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT Procedure

In order to provide all children with significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational gaps, the Cabot School receives Title I, Part A funds.  - a. All communication will be given to the grant manager.

- b. How to reach out to, communicate with , and work with parents as equal partners
- c. How to implement and coordinate parent programs
- d. How to build ties between parents and schools.

The school agrees to take the following actions to provide this support:

- Build an educational partnership uniting the community, families of our students, and Cabot School faculty and staff in a strong and inclusive culture of learning.
 - We are one school, one community, and one crew. Our language and practices are consistent across cohorts.
 - We create experiences that span cohorts
 - We create experiences that span communities (family, faculty, staff, community, students).
 - We are crew, not passengers.
- We agree to the following:
 - Leadership will create opportunities for family engagement.
 - Leadership will begin partnerships with community based organizations that can help support after school programming and out of school learning opportunities.
